Marin Water program offers customer a solution to two problems at once:

When he first noticed water pooling around the downspouts at his Lucas Valley home, Marin Water customer Michael P. shuffled through various plans to address the situation.

He tried downspout extenders, and even contemplated an expensive, contractor-installed French drain system. But when he reviewed Marin Water's DIY Rain Barrel Giveaway program, Michael, always water efficiency minded, saw a solution to two problems.



The free barrels are the result of a collaboration between Marin Water and San Rafael-based EO Products. These non-food-grade barrels can be easily converted into water storage barrels for use in residential and commercial rainwater catchment systems, enabling Marin Water customers to supplement their outdoor watering needs. Since the program launched in May 2024, more than 750 barrels have been given out to Marin Water customers interested in capturing rainfall for later use. It's Time to Dial Back Your Irrigation

As we head into fall and the weather cools off, your plants need less water. Don't forget to dial back your irrigation controllers this fall!

Tired of adjusting your watering schedule every time the seasons change? Try using a Smart Irrigation Controller!

Smart Irrigation Controllers access current weather conditions in an area using either a soil moisture probe or an internet connection to local weather stations. Based upon this information, the controllers automatically adjust watering schedules for you, making them very water efficient. Make sure you get a WaterSense certified model for guaranteed efficiency!
