#### **The Eco-Friendly Garden Tour is back! Save the date for May 9th**

Find inspiration at the 16th annual Eco-Friendly Garden Tour, a self-guided event showcasing low-water, sustainable landscapes across Sonoma and Marin counties. The tour features 27 unique gardens including both professionally designed spaces and personal passion projects which all demonstrate how beautiful gardens can thrive with less water.

One highlight this year is a cluster of neighboring gardens in Petaluma where homeowners came together to transform their street. The street has been designated as Petaluma's first Neighborhood Greenway. It started as a traffic-slowing initiative, but the group used that as a springboard for greening efforts. They have collaborated with ReLeaf Petaluma, Daily Acts and Cool Petaluma on different environmental initiatives. By redesigning their landscapes with locally adapted, drought-tolerant plants, the group reduced stormwater runoff, supported biodiversity, and created a shared sense of place. Their collaboration shows how community-driven efforts can make a meaningful environmental impact, and it's a must-see stop on the tour.

This year's tour introduces 20 new gardens, making it well worth a return visit. A full list of participating gardens is available now on the Partnership's website. In April, garden locations will be available to those who have registered for the event, allowing attendees to plan their route in advance.

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**Landscape Professionals: Set yourself apart with a QWEL Rainwater certification!**

Looking for a way to sharpen your landscaping skills? Get your Qualified Water Efficient Landscaper (QWEL) Rainwater certification to set yourself

apart!

Rainwater is a valuable resource that when collected and stored, can be used as an alternative water source helping offset the demand on existing water systems, such as wells, and municipal water. Water is a precious resource in California and rainwater catchment is one strategy that can help protect this resource. The purpose of this training is to introduce landscape installers and other water system professionals to the basics of rainwater catchment system design and installation.

**This class is limited to professionals working in Sonoma, Marin, and Mendocino counties.**
